

Having wrapped in late October of last year, director Taika Waititi is currently in the midst of the lengthy post-production phase for Marvel's Thor: Ragnarok, which means a trailer is probably still a few months out, likely set to arrive mid-to-late April with James Gunn's highly anticipated Guardians of the Galaxy, Vol. 2. At a recent Rooftop Films gala (where he was being honored), Waititi, who is best known for his acclaimed work on smaller indie films like What We Do In The Shadows and Hunt For The Wilderpeople, sat down with the A.V.
