

Until Man of Steel is released, we have no idea whether or not that will be the beginning of a shared universe for Warner Bros. and their stable of DC Comics superheroes. Many fans expected that 2011's Green Lantern would be the start of exactly that (especially with rumours of a cameo for Clark Kent) but no such luck.
