

The Flash has now lost two directors due to &quot;creative differences&quot; with Warner Bros., and a week after Rick Famuyiwa issued a statement explaining that he pitched a version of the movie with, &quot;my voice, humor, and heart,&quot; Ezra Miller has weighed in on what the next filmmaker to take over will need. Interestingly, he too mentions heart, something which the TV show has never had an issue with. &quot;I think that the most important quality is the open heart,&quot; the Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them star tells Cinema Blend. &quot;I think that The Flash has to be a story that is heartfelt.
