

Speaking with Total Film about his film career (including his upcoming projects Rise Of The Guardians and Les Misérables) actor Hugh Jackman is, of course, asked about 20th Century Fox's The Wolverine. The film, which is based on Frank Miller's story arc which sees Logan in Japan, will be the sixth time that Jackman has played the clawed mutant.
