

There's less than two weeks until director Justin Kurzel's Assassin's Creed adaptation releases in theatres. The Ubisoft game series is best known for its variety of historical settings, from the Third Crusade to 19th century London. In a recent interview with French website PREMIERE, Kurzel shared some interesting ideas on where he would set a sequel, and it's definitely something unexpected. "I thought about maybe not going too far back, maybe into, like, the '50's in America. You know, I think that could be a really interesting period around the Cold War. Traditionally, I think they've gone back further than that. Recent history is something I'm quite interested in. You can definitely kind of do a film-noir thing to it." The Assassins series has yet to step into such recent history, so a Cold War setting would certainly be a bold choice if the film series continues.
