

Filming is currently underway in Atlanta for Marvel Studios' eighteenth theatrical production, Black Panther, and while the studio has largely kept most of the shoot behind closed doors, it sounds like they may just be prepping to film a major outdoors action sequence in the not-so-distant future. According to Variety, the production team for the Ryan Coogler-directed feature will be making the trek to Busan, South Korea later this year and will use the port city as the backdrop for a massive chase scene involving major characters. The report adds that a number of notable landmarks, including Gwangalli beach, Gwangan Bridge, and the Jagalchi fish market near Nampodong will be seen during the extended sequence. Mr. Romance Film, a local production service company, confirmed the shoot and may have let slip a small plot detail or two: "The shoot, which will involve some 150 cars and more than 700 people, is a car chase scene with the protagonist and the villain...
