I realized the characters of the dwarves are the difference. Their energy and disdain of anything politically correct brings a new kind of spirit to it. And that's why I thought, OK, this could be fun!" If you thought Joss Whedon had it tough spreading screentime amongst his ensemble cast, Peter Jackson has it even tougher.
