Spike Lee's upcoming adaptation (which is also an American remake of the 2003 South Korean film of the same name) was originally slated to begin production this Spring, with actor Josh Brolin in the lead role. However, due to Brolin's press commitments to the third Men In Black film, Oldboy will instead begin production in the late summer or early fall, after press on MIB3 is finished.
