

Unveiled at the 2011 San Diego Comic Con, Daniel LuVisi's Last Man Standing was met with a great deal of interest from both fans and studios alike. In August, it was revealed that Paramount had purchased the rights to the movie from Heavy Metal Publishing, while the graphic novel (which sold out in less than two hours at the event) would be expanded into an ongoing comic book series. Variety now report that the project is moving ahead with the hiring of David Leslie Johnson, writer of Orphan, Red Riding Hood and Wrath of the Titans. The site describe the story as being set 600 years in the future and following an invincible soldier created to help Earth win a war against Mars.
